However, the right to demonstrate cannot come at the expense of the right of others to counter-demonstrate, to teach, or to engage in academic pursuits requiring uninterrupted attention. Every member of our community has the right to: Demonstrate / Rally / Picket Circulate petitions and distribute ideas Partake in debates Invite outsiders to participate, and the freedom to express opinions on any subject. The University reasonably regulates the Time Place Manner of certain forms of public expression <i>to protect the rights of</i> Free speech Free press Academic freedom The University may restrict expression that constitutes a genuine threat of harassment, that unjustifiably invades an individual's privacy, or that falsely defames a specific individual. Will not consider the respondent's prior conduction, unless the respondent was previous found to be responsible, or the previous incident was substantially similar to the present allegation(s) and/or the information indicates pattern of behavior Can resolve certain cases through an informat process with the respondent.
