Kevin Matthews

Kevin C. Matthews is deputy director of the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture, one of the world's leading cultural institutions devoted African American and African Diaspora experiences. In this role he promotes the Center's vision to facilitate access and community engagement, and oversees communications and development, while honoring the tradition of Black literacy and librarianship. Previously, K.C. was Area Director for the New York City office of UNCF – the United Negro College Fund. He has the distinction of serving as the fifth and eighth Executive Director of Columbia University's Double Discovery Center, the pre-college division founded in 1965 to house the Upward Bound and Talent Search Programs for low-income and first-generation college youngsters. Mr. Matthews attended NYC public schools in South Jamaica, Queens before completing undergraduate and post-graduate studies at Columbia University. He has lived in Harlem most of his adult life.
